




Promise Stitching is relaxing and easy. Many of you have said you are interested, but the day and time we meet is not convenient.

MARCH WORKSHOP

The March workshop is to be on Piped Binding methods. The Ricky Tims method requires a couple of specialty items. I thought you might want to be looking to see if you already have these and if not, you will have some time to purchase them.

You will need 2 specialty feet for your machine; an edge stitching foot (sometimes called an edge joining foot) and a 7 groove Pin-tucking foot. You will need some #3 pearl cotton *** (I usually use white) enough to go around your small wall hanging or practice piece, plus about a yard. (The knit/needlepoint shop in Bear City has it) left and right. There is no hand stitching.

SUPPLY LIST:

Machine in good working order (need to have needle adjustment capability)

Sewing machine feet: **standard foot, 5-grove pintuck foot** or **7-groove pintuck foot** or **zipper foot** and **edge-stitching foot******.

Small ruler with a 45° mark

Vanishing (wash away) thread (spool & bobbin) Patchworks has some.

Thread to match project

Glue stick

One quilt sandwich, approximately 12" to 18" square or rectangle—squared up (this would be a good opportunity to practice your machine quilting)

From straight or Crosswise grain cut -

Two - 1" x width of quilt sandwich + 8" (piping fabric) - pressed in half lengthwise

Two - 1" x **length** of quilt sandwich + 8" (piping fabric) - pressed in half lengthwise

Two - 3" x width of quilt sandwich + 8" (binding fabric) - pressed in half lengthwise

Two -3" x length of quilt sandwich +8" (binding fabric) - pressed in half lengthwise

perle cotton for piping will be provided *

This edgestitch foot is for a Bernina, but most all makes have a similar foot.



2011 BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Here is block #4. It is pieced and the flowers are appliquéd and the handle is a gold cord. I tucked the ends in the upper sides, leaving the rest loose. You, of course, can put a single flower in the vase, some shells or maybe a couple of bananas....



SWAP-A-BLOCK

The new blocks are not due until April's meeting. That does not mean to wait until April Fools Day to get started. Being snowed in is a good inspiration to get started now. The blocks are bigger so you don't have to make as many, but

you do have to make them. Here is the description and instructions

again.




SWAP-A-BLOCK

This somewhat scrappy block will measure 12 1/2" (unfinished).

Fabrics: One fabric should be yellow, others should be brights that read as solid.

Construction: Using 1 yellow fabric, and one fabric of your choice, *Cut 2 rectangles, 4" x 12" and place them right sides together.


*Make a grid on the yellow fabric by drawing a line at 4" and 8", then draw diagonal lines as shown. This will make a grid that will create half-square triangles.




*Stitch 1/4" on each side of the diagonal lines.

*Cut apart on the 2 vertical lines and then on diagonal lines between the stitching. (You will have 6 squares, each with one yellow triangle.)

*Layout the squares so that they are on the diagonal with the yellow triangles pointing toward each other.





*Cut 10 - 31/2" squares from your remaining brights and place around the half-square triangles to complete a 16 patch block.

Press stitched rows in opposite directions and the columns will nest together.

Make 12 – 16 patch blocks to exchange.

^{*}Square-up, half-square triangles, to 31/2".
