know Bonnie and I are looking forward to seeing all your Crayola Crayons works of art. Can't Wait!







- All quilts including the challenge and wall hangings need to have a hanging sleeve.
- All quilts 70 inches and greater, the hanging sleeve must be broken (opened) half way across to permit a supporting hanger when being displayed in the show.
- Sleeves must be 4 inches deep for the hanger and 2 inches shorter that is, 1 inch in from the left and right sides:

Boutique Guidelines

If you are entering crafts or hand-made items at the Busy Bears quilt show, there are a few guidelines to follow:

GENERAL

- All items must be hand-crafted by guild members
- If you are selling items in the boutique, you are expected to work at least one shift at the boutique, so please sign up when the worker sign-up sheets go around.
- All items must be listed on the 2015 Boutique Form. It will be printed in the July and August newsletters. It will also be available to download from the Busy Bears website:
 This completed form must be turned in along with your entries.

PREPARING THE BOUTIQUE FORM

- List the items by number. Enter description, quantity and price. Price all items in even-dollar amounts (\$3.00, not \$2.99)
- Enter **multiples** of one item (like five birdhouses) **under one item number** (put "5" in "quantity" column).
- Please make a copy of the form for yourself, as it will not be returned to you.

SUBMITTING ITEMS

• Attach a removable white string tag to each item with a safety pin, or, if it is a hard surface, with a sticky dot. List **only** your item#, your initials and the price on the tags. Tags will be available at the July and August guild meetings prior to the quilt show. If you need me to send you some, email me at

Bring all items to the show site on Friday at 4 p.m. Please have completed boutique form with you. **Please ensure that all items are tagged.** We will need to check your items against the form and have you initial the form. You may then leave your items; we will display them later, after we've received all entries.
