General Meeting Minutes January 17, 2022

I. Call to order

President Sue Boylin called to order the regular meeting of the Busy Bears Quilt Guild at 6:00 pm on January 17, 2022 at Mary Johnson Center of Community Church, 40946 Big Bear Blvd., Big Bear Lake, CA.

II. Approval of minutes from last meeting

Motion was made by Wendy Stephens and second by Sue Bost to approve minutes of November 2021 meeting as published in January 2021 newsletter. Minutes approved.

III. Open issues

- a. Newsletter Belinda Evans noted an error in that the Award Ribbons for the Mini Quilt Shows of 2021 were presented by President Sue Boylin not Lorraine Taylor as published. Error to be corrected.
- b. Treasurer's Report Treasurer's reports for November and December published in the January newsletter were approved upon motion by Belinda Evans, second by Dan Syverson.
- c. Membership Laurie Nahay announced 20 paid members at this time.
- d. Programs Lorraine Taylor received a letter for the Quilt Guild from the Doves organization thanking the Guild for our support and outlining Doves work in the community. The program in February will be a "Strip Poker" game with fall color 2 ½ in. strips; the workshop will be a strip race. March program will be Quilt University with stations manned by Guild members.
- e. 2023 Opportunity Quilt Belinda Evans and Lys Axelson announced kits were available at tonight's meeting for those participating in making the quilt.
- f. 2022 Quilt Show Sue Bost contacted the Middle School and is moving forward on planning the Show at that location. Tickets have been ordered for the Opportunity Drawing.
- g. President Sue Boylin presented a list of open positions in the Guild and Quilt Show Committee asking members to consider filling one of them.

IV. New business

Belinda Evans discussed the Heart Quilts the Guild makes in sympathy for members who are suffering severe illness or death in their family. We are asking for members to help build a supply of 10 inch heart blocks so we have a supply ready when needed.

President Sue Boylin nominated Belinda Evans to be Guild Parliamentarian which was unanimously approved.

Dan Syverson suggested some new Philanthropic ideas for the Guild – Collecting Fat Quarters for drawings at the Guild Boutiques and small over-the-door Quilts for First Responders Quarters.

V. Adjournment

President Sue Boylin adjourned the meeting at 7:55pm.



FEBRAURY 8TH - HARI KUYŌ

Laurie Nahay shared this wonderful story of the Japanese Buddhist and Shinto Festival of Broken Needles. The day celebrates the work of seamstresses, needleworkers, sewists, and everyone else who works skillfully with needles. Below is some in-depth information on the holiday.

Hari-Kuyō is the Japanese Buddhist and Shinto Festival of Broken Needles, celebrated on February 8th. It is celebrated as a memorial to all the needles broken in their service during the past year and as an opportunity to pray for improved skills. Hari-Kuyō began four hundred years ago as a way for housekeepers and professional needle-workers to acknowledge their work over the past years and respect their tools. This is in keeping with the philosophy of "not wasting" or "paying honor to the small things" exemplified in the concept of Mottainai. On this day, the seamstresses take a holiday and bring their old needles to the temple to stick them in a piece of Tofu or Konnyaku'.

Thank you for sharing Laurie.


