

BUSY BEARS QUILT GUILD General Meeting Minutes

November 18, 2024

I. Call to order

President Lindy Edmond called to order the regular meeting of the Busy Bears Quilt Guild at 11:02 a.m. on November 18, 2024 at the Historical Chapel of Community Church, 40946 Big Bear Blvd., Big Bear Lake, Ca. Pledge of Allegiance led by Michele Parris.

II. Approval of Minutes from last meeting

The minutes of the October 21, 2024 General Meeting as published in the November 2024 newsletter were approved on a motion by Kelley Smythe, second by Flo Snyder. The motion was carried and approved.

III. Open Issues

- a) **Treasurer Report** Michele Rustigan was absent. Tammy Laubach reported that the Quilt Show receipts and expenses were all listed in the August report, none in the September report. August's balance as reported was \$15,696.53. September's balance as reported was \$15,654.24. October's balance as reported was \$16,234.24. Savings account was not reported. There was an error with the Quilt Show financial report which was reviewed and resolved. A motion to approve the August, September, and October treasurer's reports was made by Bonnie Marshall and seconded by Heidi Llanes. The motion was carried and approved.
- b) **Membership** Heidi Llanes reported 67 members for 2024. Heidi shared that 3 members have submitted their dues for 2025. Heidi welcomed members to submit their membership dues by mail or at the January general meeting. The Guild welcomed 1 guest, Lea and a longtime member, Fran was present.
- c) **Sunshine and Shadows** Theresa Georgi was absent and Janice Stillwell announced the birthdays for November and December. Members sang Happy Birthday to the members present. Condolences were also made.
- d) **Philanthropy** Linda Salka reported the Guild has 27 bears and 20 bunnies but they are going fast. Linda has bear patterns to share and will receive the bunny pattern soon. Bears, bunnies can be created and sewn at the Charity Sew workshops in early 2025.
- e) **Publicity and Marketing -** Nothing to report.
- f) **2025 Opportunity Quilt** Kelley Smythe reported that the calendar is open from November through December for showing the quilts at events. The quilt will be displayed at the December Holiday Boutique.
- g) **2026 Opportunity Quilt** Lys Axelson reports it is done already.
- h) 2025 Fall Block Swap Lys Axelson reported the theme is Celebrating 35 years of the Guild. Must use 1/2 yard of the coral fabric provided by the Guild. Use off white not white. Any pattern, any size, quilt-pillow-whatever you want. Trade the blocks in March, 2025. Due August 18, 2025. Sign up no later than December 1, 2024 and pick up a packet.

- i) **UFO Challenge** Janice Stillwell reports that the new UFO Challenge has begun and ends October 2025. \$10 to enter and can submit as many projects as you like. Each submittal receives a ticket to the drawing in October.
- j) 2025 Challenge Quilt Wendy Stephens reported that projects will be voted on at the July 2025 general meeting. Theme is "These boots are made for" and each participant will add the last word in this title for their individual project. Wendy said don't adjust the size of the boot. 60% must be a collage. Kits are available now. Quilts will be displayed at the Quilt Show and possibly entered for judging.
- k) **Stitchy Fingers** Sue Bost says the next Stitchy Fingers is this Friday, November 22, 10 a.m. at Lorraine Tailor's house. Contact Laurie Hancock to get on the mailing list. R.S.V.P.

Stitchy Fingers is the second and fourth Friday of every month.

- Middle School Sewing Camp Lindy Edmond reports the next committee meeting will be in January. Spring camp is March 24 - 27 and open to boys too. Hoping for an Autumn Camp as well.
- m) Special Events Debbie Pence reports the Christmas Party is December 2, 5 p.m. cocktails, dinner 6p.m., Santana Mavericks restaurant, \$25 Guild pays remainder. Steak, chicken fettuccine, or veggie (spinach ravioli). Ornament exchange wrapped in a fat quarter. Sign-ups today with meal selection. Picnic will be July 2025 to be announced.
- n) **Ways and Means** Elaine Dobiesz reported that the Tea Party is June 7, 2025 and will be a no-host tea party. Elaine has the 6 centerpieces needed. Location: Historical Chapel.

No further nominations. The general members voted their approval and none were opposed. Lindy Edmond reviewed the names of the committee chairs and members. Members stood and were recognized for their willingness to step up for the Guild.

May Program Robin Davis will join us to show examples of Crazy Quilting creations in a trunk show. I'm sure she will have some amazing examples.

May Workshop Robin Davis will return to teach techniques of crazy quilting. We all know how talented she is so I'm sure you will learn a lot of tips and tricks in her class. The cost is \$25

June Program will be our Annual Silent Auction so start thinking what you would like to clear out of your sewing space. All proceeds go to the guild.

Guidelines: **Please** use the sign in and sign out sheets when taking or returning your project. **Do** a quick housekeeping on your project (loose threads, pet hair, etc.) **Remember** no "Made by" labels on projects. **All projects** to be turned in at monthly general meetings at Philanthropy table. **Do not** just leave items at Philanthropy table, **label** your bag that the item(s) are in to ensure you get credit for them. **If you** plan to enter something in the annual show your comfort quilt or bears must be received no later than August 1, 2025. **Quilt tops** are not accepted. **Tops** must be quilted and finished.

- Bear Valley Hospice and Dove's comfort quilts suggested size: 44" 46" by 58" 62".
- Moms & Dads Project baby quilts suggested size: 36" by 36".
- Seven Stars Foundation provides quilts for children of military families, aged 5 17 who attend YMCA camps across the nation. Suggested size: Lap to twin. Fabric available.
- **Kids in Crisis** program makes teddy bears and bunnies for first responders to carry in their vehicles and hand out as needed when responding to emergencies.

You are always welcome to use your own fabrics and designs for these projects.

The Busy Bears Quilt Guild provides batting and backing as well.
