May 20, 2024

I. Call to order

President Lindy Edmond called to order the regular meeting of the Busy Bears Quilt Guild at 11:01 a.m. on May 20, 2024 at Youth Center of Community Church, 40946 Big Bear Blvd., Big Bear Lake, Ca. Pledge of Allegiance led by Michele Parris.

II. Approval of Minutes from last meeting

The minutes of the April 15, 2023 General Meeting as published in the May 2024 newsletter were approved on a motion by Flo Snyder, second by Michele Rustigan. The motion was carried and approved.

III. Open Issues

COMFORT QUILTS & TEDDY BEARS

Guidelines: **Please** use the sign in and sign out sheets when taking or returning your project. **Do** a quick housekeeping on your project (loose threads, pet hair, etc.) **Remember** no "Made by" labels on projects. **All projects** to be turned in at monthly general meetings at Philanthropy table. **Do not** just leave items at Philanthropy table, **label** your bag that the item(s) are in to ensure you get credit for them. **If you** plan to enter something in the annual show your comfort quilt or bears must be received no later than August 1, 2024. **Quilt tops** are not accepted. **Tops** must be quilted and finished.

- **Bear Valley Hospice and Dove's** comfort quilts suggested size: 44" 46" by 58" 62". Kits are available. The BBQG provides batting and backing as well.
- Moms & Dads Project baby quilts suggested size: 36" by 36". Pre-cut kits available.
- **Seven Stars Foundation** provides quilts for children of military families, aged 5 17 who attend YMCA camps across the nation. Suggested size: Lap to twin. Fabric available.
- **Kids in Crisis** program makes teddy bears and bunnies for first responders to carry in their vehicles and hand out as needed when responding to emergencies. Patters and fabric available.

You are always welcome to use your own fabrics and designs for these projects. Look forward to seeing your creations.



If more than 1 is in the same category circle (2) or (3) choice Attach a color photo 4x6 inch min. of your quilt (finished or not) to the backside of this page Print two pages of this form. Page 1 is for the Show Label, the second page with the photo of the quilt is for the Show Layout.

2024 Marketplace Guidelines

If you are entering your hand-made crafts and items in the Busy Bears Quilt Show, there are a few guidelines you must follow.

General

- Participants must turn in at least one philanthropic quilt or 20 teddy bears.
- All items must be hand-crafted by guild members.
- If you are selling items in the marketplace, you are expected to work at least one shift at the marketplace (this does include set-up and tear down). Please sign up when the worker sign-up sheets go around in June.
- All items MUST be listed on the 2024 Marketplace Form. It will be available to download from the Busy Bear website. This completed form must be turned in along with your marketplace items.

Preparing the Marketplace Form

- List the items by number. Enter a description, quantity and price. All the prices must be in **whole dollars** (\$5.00 not \$4.99)
- Enter multiple of one item under one item number (for 10 Christmas ornaments, put 10 in the quantity column)
- Please make a copy of the form for yourself, as it will not be returned to you.

Submitting Items

• Attach a removable white tag to each item. List your **Item #** and your **initials** on one side of the tag and the **price** on the other side of the tag. Tags will be available prior to the quilt show at the general meets.

Bring all your items to Destination Big Bear on Friday between 11am - 1pm. Please have your completed form with you. **Please ensure that all items are tagged.** Once your items are checked in, you may leave your items and we will display them once we have received everyone's items. If you have your items in bins please have your name on the bins to ensure you get the correct bin when you come to retrieve your unsold items.

Picking up items

• Unsold items need to be picked up Sunday at 4:00pm, once the show is over.
