General Meeting Minutes

February 17, 2025

I. Call to order

President Lindy Edmond called to order the regular meeting of the Busy Bears Quilt Guild at 11:01 a.m. on February 17, 2025 at the Heritage Hall, Community Church, 40946 Big Bear Blvd., Big Bear Lake, Ca. Pledge of Allegiance led by Michele Parris.

II. Approval of Minutes from last meeting

The minutes of the November 18, 2024 General Meeting as published in the January and February 2025 newsletters were approved on a motion by Jeannie Mazzacane, second by Sue Bost. The motion was carried and approved.

III. Open Issues

- a) Treasurer Report Tammy Laubach reported the November/December 2024 and the January treasurer's reports. November 2024 as \$15,540.24. December 2024 as \$14,390.91. January 2025 as \$12,875.91. Michele Parris asked about the bank statements and accessibility. Statements are received via mail by the president and delivered to the treasurer. Bank statements are up-to-date. Susan Solomonson motioned to approve the treasurer's report and Kelley Smythe seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- **b) Membership** Heidi Llanes reported 23 members and received more today. Coffee Chat will be March 25, 6:30 p.m. at her house. New members, board members and general members to attend.
- c) Sunshine and Shadows Theresa Georgi announced the birthdays for February. She invited the members to sing "Happy Birthday" to the birthday members present. Marilynda Moore has volunteered to be on this committee.
- d) Philanthropy Cathy Fraser shared that no baby quilts are needed at this time. Quilts are needed for Seven Stars as this is their last year and we presently have 0 quilts for them. There are 15 quilts for Doves, 7 for Hospice. Kits are available. Linda Salka shared that bears can be made with an assortment of faces. Linda demonstrated bears can be sewn without turning them inside out. Get creative with capes, ribbons, but no buttons.

PROGRAMS

It looks like winter has arrived. I hope you've taken advantage of these snowy days to get some sewing done.

March Program we will be playing "strip poker" not the kind that you need to layer up your clothing lol. It will be played similar to "Left, Center, Right" using 2 1/2" strips of fabric- bring your own or the guild will provide them.

March Workshop we will have a strip race making quilts for charity using strips from the Strip Poker. More 2 1/2 strips will be provided. There will be a prize for the first person to finish sewing their strips together. It's a lot of fun and I've even heard it gets competitive at times. There is no charge.

April Program we will have the pleasure of Laurie Hancock sharing her beautiful quilts in a trunk show. She will also show quilts with raw edge appliqué and turned under appliqué leading into the workshop the next day.

April Workshop features Belinda Evans teaching the techniques for raw edge appliqué and turned under appliqué. You will choose which technique you would like to use to create the project she has selected. The cost is \$10.

May Program Robin Davis will join us to show examples of Crazy Quilting creations in a trunk show. I'm sure she will have some amazing examples.

May Workshop Robin Davis will return to teach techniques of crazy quilting. We all know how talented she is so I'm sure you will learn a lot of tips and tricks in her class. The cost is \$25

June Program will be our Annual Silent Auction so start thinking what you would like to clear out of your sewing space. All proceeds go to the guild.

June Workshop - Manny Caldera Featherweight Class. Students will learn how to clean and oil their Featherweight, how often and what tools they will need without taking it down the hill. The Featherweight popup shop will have various items related to their sewing machine. Two of the most important items are grease and oil and carrying bags - Manny.

July Program- Those participating in the challenge quilt will bring them to the meeting and members will vote on their favorite.

There will also be discussion about the upcoming guilt show.

The annual picnic will take the place of our workshop.

August program we will start the evening with a potluck dinner and have a discussion about the quilt show.

August workshop - Progressive Sewing Room Tour.

September program- Winners of the quilt show will be presented with their ribbons and viewers' choice will be announced.



COMFORT QUILTS & TEDDY BEARS

Guidelines: **Please** use the sign in and sign out sheets when taking or returning your project. **Do** a quick housekeeping on your project (loose threads, pet hair, etc.) **Remember** no "Made by" labels on projects. **All projects** to be turned in at monthly general meetings at Philanthropy table. **Do not** just leave items at Philanthropy table, **label** your bag that the item(s) are in to ensure you get credit for them. **If you** plan to enter something in the annual show your comfort quilt or bears must be received no later than August 1, 2025. **Quilt tops** are not accepted. **Tops** must be quilted and finished.

- Bear Valley Hospice and Dove's comfort quilts suggested size: 44" 46" by 58" 62".
- Moms & Dads Project baby quilts suggested size: 36" by 36".
- **Seven Stars Foundation** provides quilts for children of military families, aged 5 17 who attend YMCA camps across the nation. Suggested size: Lap to twin. Fabric available.
- Kids in Crisis program makes teddy bears and bunnies for first responders to carry in their vehicles and hand out as needed when responding to emergencies.

You are always welcome to use your own fabrics and designs for these projects.

The Busy Bears Quilt Guild provides batting and backing as well.


